### Headteacher's Update

Welcome to our first newsletter of the new academic year.

We finished last year on a real high with a busy week of events. Over 150 students received awards at our annual prize giving, our talented musicians and dancers wowed the audience at the summer showcase with a special performance of 'Bridge over Troubled Water' and Years 7 and 8 rounded off the week with a 'summer party'.

We started the term celebrating improved GCSE results. Our students performed well in the new style Maths and English GCSEs with 68% of them scoring a grade 4 or higher in both Maths and English (the government's new basics measure). This compares favourably with the figure of 66% last year for those gaining at least a C grade in these subjects.

Notable individual performances from Lucas Wilson who was awarded a grade 9 in his English Language paper and achieved A and A\* grades in all other subjects. Other students gaining predominantly top grades were

Luke Potter, William Hall, Sean Owen and Amy Harrison. Emma Fentiman achieved the highest performance in Maths, achieving an A\* in Further Maths and a grade 8 in the new GCSE.

In terms of progress, Amy Harrison, Jess Pickering, Chenelle Stork and Jack Watson all achieved at least a grade higher on average per subject than expected based on prior attainment. Many more students achieved excellent grades in a number of subjects and we congratulate them all and wish them well as they move on to the next stage of education or employment.

We have welcomed 85 new Year 7 students who have made a great start. As we 'expect more' to 'achieve more' we are aiming for even higher standards of behaviour this year. Despite the vast majority of students behaving well, even 1 lesson where learning is disrupted is too many. Our high expectations start with our school uniform and almost every student has returned looking very smart. We need parental support in order to maintain these standards and I thank you in advance for ensuring your child is wearing the uniform appropriately. By allowing parents to shop around for the basic uniform items means that costs are lower and a pair of sensible black shoes is more likely to be cheaper than branded trainers.

Another cost that I know you want us to keep to a minimum is school meals and we have absorbed a recent 10p price rise by looking for greater efficiencies. Some sandwich prices have increased as these have been increased by the supplier but all other items remain at 2015 prices and we now offer a meal deal with free vegetables with a main meal almost every day. The cashless system allows parents to monitor spending and if you have any concerns please do contact us as we can set spending limits. If you need help with your cashless account please contact the school office.

The next major event on the school calendar is the school walk and our students have again selected 4 House Charities: Mind, Brake, Teenage Cancer Trust and British Red Cross. The school walk is our main fundraising event for the school fund, which we use to pay for things that our school funding will not cover such as furniture for the social areas and goals for the playground. Please support us in raising as much money as possible by collecting sponsors and giving your support and encouragement in completing the school walk on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> September.

On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September at 5.00 pm we are inviting all Year 5/6 students and parents into school for our Open Evening. We have a great school with fantastic students and if you know any Year 6 parents, please do encourage them to come and see what we have to offer. Likewise, I look forward to seeing those of you with children in Year 6; I am sure brothers and sisters will be keen to show them round.

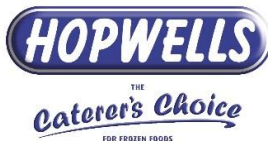


Leo Colyer – The Ruth Aldridge
