<p>The Yorkshire museum which is situated in York's Museum gardens. This museum contains exhibits from Roman and Anglo-Saxon Britain or The Hull and East Riding Museum in Hull which also contains artefacts from both Roman and Anglo-Saxon Britain.</p>	<p>Some Greek and Roman myths. You can find a lot of them free online or you could get a book out of the library. We also have books which are a modern take on ancient myths such as the Percy Jackson series by Rick Riordan-who wrote the Trials of Apollo book you read.</p>	<p>A comic strip or story of some kind which features your own hero. It could be a superhero you create or a mythical hero from your own imagination.</p>	<p>Some of the other Arthur myths which originally formed part of Morte D'Arthur. You could find out more about characters such as Guinevere, Merlin, Morgan le Fey and Lancelot.</p>
<p>Half term 2:</p> <p>Poets have traditionally been inspired by Nature and a lot of poems are written about natural landscapes and about seasons- with Autumn being particular popular.</p> <p>So visit a local wood or lake por just somewhere naturally beautiful and use this to inspire you creatively as you think about the sights, smells, sounds and textures of the place.</p>	<p><i>Read some more modern poetry such as Life Doesn't Frighten Me by Maya Angelou-</i> https://www.poemhunter.com/poem/life-doesn-t-frighten-me</p> <p><i>Or read some other poems by the poets you look at in class.</i></p> <p><i>For example</i></p> <p><i>To Autumn by John Keats or the poem Morte D'Arthur by Tennyson.
