It could be set anywhere in the world – either somewhere you're familiar with or somewhere you'd like to find out more about.	Carry out further research into racism and poverty today. You could focus in a particular geographical area e.g: South Africa; African refugees crossing the Mediterranean; Chinese treatment of the Uyghurs etc.
