Headteacher Update

The first 3 weeks of 2024 have been as busy as ever in school with several parents events and more coming up over the coming weeks. Year 11 students are approaching their second set of trial exams and hopefully getting into good revision habits in school and at home. We offer additional lessons every lunchtime and Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. We will also be offering revision throughout the school holiday periods at February half term, Easter and the Spring half term. Students also have access to GCSE Pod, a great on line resource for revision and self testing through the 'Check and Challenge' tasks. Mr Savage monitors all this along with other key data on school and sends regular communication to parents so that you can help support your child to make the most of what is on offer.

Our students have been busy too, setting personal goals for 2024 and seeking to be the best version of themselves. This year we have been working with Hull City's Tigers Trust who are working with various groups of students on a range of activities including sports leadership, community action and self esteem. In addition the Trust run events and competitions. Earlier this month a group of Year 9 students presented a community action project proposal which was selected to represent Tigers Trust in the Premier League Inspires competition in London later this year. The winning team is featured on the front of this Newsletter and we will ask them to tell us more about their project plans in our February edition.

The project the students plan to develop is about supporting positive mental health, something we care passionately about at TMWS. Our Well-being Centre provides support for students throughout the day and this year we are also working in partnership with Hull and East Yorkshire MIND. HEY MIND have already delivered resilience workshops to all Year 7 students and worked to support a number of individuals. We have asked them to deliver an event for parents which is taking place on Tuesday 6th February at 4:00pm in school. We hope you will be able to join us and if successful we will look to arrange further events.

This additional support has only been possible due to the generous support from the community we have received in recent years, in particular from the Snow Ball organised by James Ducker and Langland's just over a year ago. We are lucky to have such support from local businesses but as school funding becomes increasingly challenging we are looking to re-launch a PTA or Friends of TMWS association. This group will also serve as a focus group of parental opinion so that we can ensure we are delivering on the things that are important to you. If you want to support us with this you will see details in this Newsletter and on Social Media.

February starts with our annual musical production. This year our students are performing FAME ir based on the hit stage musical and 80's TV show. It will be well worth coming to see so please pop into school to buy your tickets in advance to avoid disappointment especially if you are wanting to see the show on the final evening. The show is being performed over 3 nights so hopefully we will have plenty of tickets for all. As ever we have been supported by local businesses with sponsorship and raffle prizes and the usual refreshments will be available before the show and during the interval.

Our plans to convert to Academy status and form a new Multi Academy Trust with Wyke College have been progressing through a due diligence process and planning possible governance and finance structures. Immediately after the half term break we will be formally launching a stakeholder consultation with the opportunity for parents and members of the community to attend events at TMWS on Wednesday 28th February at 6:30pm. We will be able to explain our plans and seek your views and ideas. It is very much the intention that TMWS remains at the heart of our community.

In addition to the events above parents of Year 8 students will be invited to meet subject teachers on Tuesday 20th February, with our Year 7 parent's evening taking place before Easter. It is always a pleasure to welcome parents into school and hopefully we will see you at our FAME production or one of the other events taking place in the next month.

Welcome to our Well-being Centre and Team

Who are we?

Mrs Bell & Mrs McCall work full time in the school's Well-being Centre. Their roles include supporting and encouraging the students by working with them on many aspects of their education. In liaison with the Heads of Year, Mrs Bell (ELSA) & Mrs McCall (Drawing and Talking) will identify students requiring additional support and work with them on, for example, revision programmes, past examination papers, examination anxiety, well-being, emotional literacy support, aspiration and achievement.

What do we do?

The team supports students who are struggling with all aspects of school life. The Team also supports students with their emotional health and well-being.

New developments this year have been the additional of a HeyMind Worker Laura Bushnell every Tuesday who has provided support and intervention to over 200 students across the whole school community.

On a Monday we also have the support and intervention for Y10 and Y11 from Mrs Christina Colmer who is working alongside these year groups to promote Emotional Resilience and Future Proofing.

With the support of these professionals, we will be offering a series of Parental Workshops so that you can be well equipped to support your child through their school life. The first session will be on 6th Feb "How to have a conversation about Mental Health" See additional advert in this newsletter.

How do students access the Well-Being Centre?

If students are struggling with any issues in school, they need to approach their own Head of Year so that they can offer them or guide them to the right support that they need. The Head of Year will determine if any additional support is needed and they will then make a referral to the Well-being Team. The individual is then allocated one of our wellbeing team to provide more intensive support for a period of 6 weeks. These appointments are made at fixed times and are planned on a weekly basis not to disrupt the same lessons and the students learning each week.

The Well-being Team meets weekly and discuss the progress being made by all the students being mentored; if we feel that additional support is needed then Mrs Curtis the Child Protection Officer/ Deputy DSL will make a referral to outside services if we feel that this is the next line of support needed. Parents are kept informed of all of this intervention and the team is available to discuss any concerns and offer support to any parent about their child.

The Well-being Centre can and is used by students who are in crisis or present as such whilst in school. Again, Heads of Year play a role here and will make a judgement to facilitate use of the Wellbeing Centre.



The E-praise Reward Scheme

Our Merits reward scheme recognises students' achievements over the course of the academic year.

Merits are awarded when students are meeting at least the standard of 'good'. This means bringing correct equipment to lesson, being on time, focusing and engaging in the lesson, not disrupting the learning of others so that they can make at least good progress too.

Merits are also rewarded at teachers' discretion for above and beyond efforts, such as excellent contributions in class, exemplary homework, etc.

Students who show really high aspiration regarding their future employability and personal development will also be recognised and awarded extra points. This includes participating in whole school activities such as: team sports, enrichment activities, open nights, community work and extra classes after school.

Attendance is really important and links strongly to academic outcomes. Every student who achieves 100% attendance will be awarded additional Merits on a weekly basis.




Accelerated Reader competition news


also be seeing which tutor group can bring in the most books. Any leftover books will be added to the library shelves or donated on.

local library offers a warm space to spend the day. As well as free Wi-Fi there are comfy seats, games, and jigsaws. Plus all the books!







School Lunches — Polite reminder and price increases

Parents are reminded to keep their child's School gateway account in credit. Our canteen staff do not like to refuse service to our students, but, if the account is in debt, TMWS is not obliged to provide food for students.

If you are having difficulty clearing a debt please contact our finance department who can discuss this with you and in the meantime please send your child with a packed lunch.

You may be entitled to Free School Meals, please follow the link below to see if you qualify.

ERYC FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Despite over a year of high inflation on food costs we have avoided price increases but as prices continue to rise and staff costs also increase we have made some small increases across most of our meals and snacks. We are continuing to offer FREE veg with any meal and will be increasing the Free School Meal allowance to £2.75 to keep pace with these increases. This will be funded by the school as the amount we receive from government remains unchanged at £2:60





Autumn Winter Uniform—V Neck Jumper/Sweatshirt/Cardigan
