

# The Market Weighton School Expect More - Achieve More

#### **Headteacher Update**

The highlight of the month has to be our annual musical production. This year we met the students of the New York School of Performing Arts during the last years of the school in the early 1980s. *Fame JR*. is the bittersweet, but ultimately inspiring, story of a diverse group of students who commit to four years of gruelling artistic and academic work. With candour, humour and insight, the show explored the issues that confront many young people today. The talent on display was inspiring and we are already looking forward to next year's production although the first challenge will be making a decision on what it will be!

Earlier this week we launched the formal consultation to convert to Academy status as part of a new Multi Academy Trust that we are forming along with 4 other local schools and Colleges. Initially based on the geographical area of travel to learn at Wyke Sixth Form College we have a working name of The Wyke Learning Trust but we are looking for suggestions on names for this new trust. If you have not already watched our launch video and read the accompanying brochure please follow this link

We are now looking to formally collect your views, we have an on line feedback form here and will be holding public consultation meetings in Market Weighton on Wednesday 28th February 2024. We will have a full presentation from Paul Britton and the other Headteachers who are forming the trust here at TMWS at 6:30pm. Alternatively, Paul and Sarah Kay-Wood will also be holding drop in sessions at Market Weighton Infant School that afternoon from 2:30pm if that is more convenient. We have been working on this project for almost a year and have made significant progress in the last few months making decisions around our proposed governance and financial structures. We expect the day -o-day operation of our schools to remain the same but we are keen to hear your views. Ultimately it will be our governors who will vote to convert to become an Academy but it is a huge decision and although I would not be recommending this if I did not believe it was right for TMWS, it is essential that we get it right! We are proud to be seen as an inclusive school at the heart of our community but we are always seeking to improve and believe that partnering with other like minded, successful institutions will further drive that improvement. If you are interested to hear more and want to hear what others think please join us on Wednesday 28th at 6:30pm in school.

A new addition to this month's Newsletter is a Sports Round Up. We share all our sporting competitions via our social media but now each month you will be able to read a summary of our student's achievements written by our PE teacher, Miss Dawson. Miss Dawson is particularly excited about the Academisation plans as she started her education at MWIS has been through MPJS, TMWS and Wyke before studying her degree and completing teacher training. Now back with us teaching PE, Kelly is excited about the opportunities for sharing curriculum expertise and resources to really focus on an excellent 3 to 18 educational experience.

Our students can now use beautifully clean and modern toilets after a complete refurbishment. We have created a lovely safe space and I am sure you will all want to support us in keeping it that way! You will be able to see for yourselves the next time you are in school. We had our Year 8 parent's evening earlier this week and the Year 7 evening will take place on Thursday 14th March 2024. Following the second set of Year 11 trial exams, taking place now, we will be inviting all Year 11 parents and students into school to collect their last set of assessment data and listen to advice on revision strategies from staff on Wednesday 20th March at 6:30pm.

Finally we are also seeking your views in our annual parent survey. Parents received a letter about this just before the half term break and it is not too late to share your views. We are always looking to improve what we do and these surveys have influenced our decisions in many areas including curriculum, wellbeing and uniform. We have also recently re-formed a Parent Teacher Association PTA, a small but enthusiastic group of parents attended the first meeting and are planning a Year 7,8 and 9 student disco as their first fundraising event on Tuesday 19th March 2024. #### What is an 'Educational Health and Care Plan?'

An EHCP is a formal and legal document which is reviewed annually that supports a child's education, health or social care needs. This review looks at the child's needs, provision and outcomes that can collectively be worked towards to help a child progress educationally.

Sometimes a child's support in school is not always able to meet their need. This may be due to the child's additional needs requiring an assessment of their need, a range of provision above what can ordinarily be available to a child (known as special educational provision) or perhaps a child's needs have significant changes that the school needs further local authority support to meet within the school setting.

More information on the Local Authority Process can be found here.

Before this process is considered as 'needed' by The Market Weighton School, there will be collective discussions that a child is not meeting the expected progress despite having a graduated approach of support and interventions. This is known as a 'Termly Review'. Termly reviews usually can last a child's educational career as this is a careful way to plan for a child on the Special educational needs register.

Other information we usually wish to collect to support an application would be a documented path of support services who have previously supported the child and a collective decision with you as a parent that an EHCPNA (Educational Health and Care Plan Needs Assessment) is required to support your child's needs further within our school.

Should this information not be gathered, TMWS may not support a parental request for an EHCPNA.



If your child needs SEND support, please contact our team E-praise or via school reception. A form Tutor, Head of Year and in some situations a Keyworker is the quickest route to speak with a member of staff. 6

If you're new to Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) then knowing where to start finding the right support for your child can be overwhelming.

You may have concerns that your child or young person is developing or behaving differently to their peers and its affecting their education. Your child or young person may have been recently diagnosed or may be in the process of being assessed. This can be a difficult, confusing and emotional time but this website has information to help and can direct you to teams that can help through your family's journey.

### **New Student Toilet Facilities Open**

After several weeks of inconvenience and managing with using other toilets around the building both sets of student toilets are now open and in use. Having not changed much in 70 years they were ready for a refurbishment and as you can see they have had a complete refit. We have added some

student art and large mirrors to each set of toilets and free sanitary products are available for collection in the girls toilets. We are monitoring the facilities throughout the day to ensure they remain in top condition with cleaning also taking place after break and lunchtime so students will always find a clean and safe space to use.

We have invested a considerable amount

of money in creating a welcoming, clean and sage space for all our students and senior staff are monitoring the toilets throughout the day to catch any students vaping or loitering in the toilets. If students are caught loitering unnecessarily they can expect to receive a C3 detention. Parents will be contacted if any students are caught with a vape, the vape will be confiscated and any students caught vaping will

the vape will be confiscated and any students caught vaping will spend a period of time working in isolation and have supervised breaks. In any cases where students are caught behaving in a way likely or intentionally to cause damage they will be banned from using the new facilities for a period of time. Other toilets are available in our Wellbeing Centre. I am sure parents will support us with this effort to maintain a safe space for all. We have seen a significant reduction in students vaping in school/on the school site this year and we would like to thank parents for your vigilance and support on this matter. Hopefully the proposed ban on disposable vapes will come into force and the ongoing publicity around the health issues with vaping in young children will help



prevent our younger students taking up the habit. Nicotine is addictive and vaping is not intended for young children who have never smoked.

Free sanitary products are available for girls to take home and use, not just to use in school, we have a large stock of a variety of products so please do encourage your child to pick some up and make use of the schemes that are providing free products to schools.

#### Do you know there is a Fire Station in Market Weighton?

The fire station on Cliffe Road is crewed by people who live or work locally. They respond to emergencies in both the local, and wider, communities.

#### Do you know Market Weighton Fire Station is Crewed by On-Call Firefighters

The On-Call firefighter role is a paid, part-time position open to those who are able to attend Market Weighton Fire Station within 5-minutes of being notified of an emergency call. Apart from training sessions and pre-arranged activities, On-Call firefighters attend their fire station when they receive an emergency call via a pocket pager. These firefighters commit to being on-call at certain times when they can stop whatever they are doing and respond to emergency situations. This means that our firefighters could be cutting the grass at home one minute and the next be on their way to cut a trapped person out of a car..... could you or someone you know rise to this challenge?

Flexible contracts allow On-Call duties to be fitted around your work and family life, meaning you may not need to change anything in relation to your current commitments to become an On-Call firefighter. We put it to you, that you have nothing to lose by speaking to us, but a lot to gain by joining us.

The types of emergencies we attend are varied. As well as fires we also attend road traffic collisions, people who are trapped, floods and storms, animal rescue and an increasing number of medical emergencies.

In addition, our role includes visiting people and businesses within the community to help prevent incidents occurring in the first place.

#### **Personal Development Day 2**

We held our second Personal Development Day of the year just before the half term holiday. While the cast of FAME were busy with their dress rehearsal and performing to our local Primary schools the rest of the school were taking part in a range of activities to support their wider development. We



welcomed Talk the Talk back to TMWS to work with Year 9 students on their confidence and public speaking skills. The *Talk About Communication* workshop is an exciting and engaging master class developing speaking and listening skills within a creative learning environment. The workshop provides numerous speaking opportunities and students are coached and supported throughout the day to

deliver a structured two minute presentation, on a topic for which they have a genuine passion, to their peers. It is common that many students lack the confidence to speak in lessons and in front of their

peers Talk the Talk aims to demonstrate that speaking out should be an experience that we CAN do – and one that is nowhere near as daunting as we might think. One of the keys to the success of the Talk The Talk programme is creating an environment of mutual respect with a supportive ethos so that when students stand up and voice their opinions, share their thoughts and present their ideas – their skills and confidence grows. As ever the feedback from the students and staff was very positive.

Half of Year 7 took part in an enterprise day delivered by Hull based For Entrepreneurs Only Next Generation. FEO NxGen events are delivered in schools and colleges by local entrepreneurs who volunteer their time to help inspire young people to think about self-employment as a career option. This is a career path that can reward hard work, resilience and determination.

All the students had a great day and showed imagination with their business ideas.

Other groups covered aspects of the Personal Social and Health Education, PSHE curriculum and Careers Education. Students take part in 4 PD Days throughout the school year.

#### The E-praise Reward Scheme

Our Merits reward scheme recognises students' achievements over the course of the academic year.

Merits are awarded when students are meeting at least the standard of 'good'. This means bringing correct equipment to lesson, being on time, focusing and engaging in the lesson, not disrupting the learning of others so that they can make at least good progress too.

Merits are also rewarded at teachers' discretion for above and beyond efforts, such as excellent contributions in class, exemplary homework, etc.

Students who show really high aspiration regarding their future employability and personal development will also be recognised and awarded extra points. This includes participating in whole school activities such as: team sports, enrichment activities, open nights, community work and extra classes after school.

Attendance is really important and links strongly to academic outcomes. Every student who achieves 100% attendance will be awarded additional Merits on a weekly basis.




The Student Librarian Assistants have put together their own display. This time they have chosen their favourite Romance & Relationship themed books.

#### Accelerated Reader competition news

Since the last newsletter, students have earned 35 certificates for reading. There were 31 Bronze awards for reading over 100,000 words. Hudson Turner and Lillie Loftus both earned Silver certificates for reading 500,000 words. Scarlet Bielby-Moss and Erin Jackson earned Gold certificates for reading 1 million words.

Year 7 have maintained their position as the year group with the highest word count and are even further ahead of nearest rivals, Year 9. receive an equivalent number of tokens to swap for books.


Students will receive an accolade for participating and we will also be seeing which tutor group can bring in the most books. Any leftover books will be added to the library shelves or donated on.


#### Books to buy using the WBD £1 token:

In this book, Angelo and his friends discover the Latchitts' old laboratories and the terrifying creatures that still live there. At least they did, until they managed to escape . . .


I predict this will be a very popular choice so you'll have to be quick to snap up a copy.


#### Loki: Tales of a bad god—Louie Stowell
